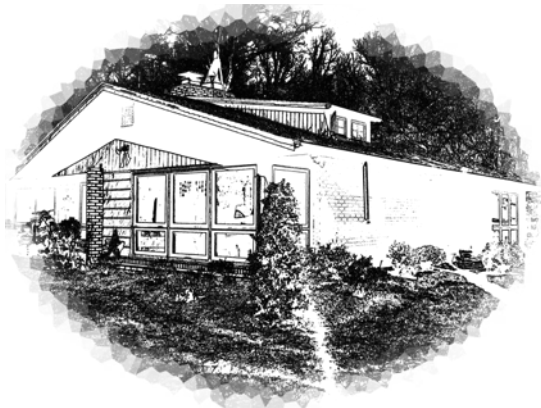

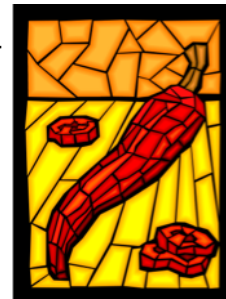


Enjoy Good Food and Fellowship at the Chili Challenge

More about Moyaone's May Day Celebration

Sunday, May 1 will mark the first annual May Day to be celebrated in the Moyaone. Our May Day will reach to England for inspiration. May Day is one of the four ancient Celtic cross-quarter days, making it an astronomical holiday as it falls between the March equinox and June solstice. Originating from its Celtic name, "Belthane," Beltane was a spring celebration that included dancing, singing, and special bonfires; house doors and animals would be decorated with yellow May flowers and ribbons. During this time, in various communities in Ireland, people would visit special wells; the Beltane dew was believed to bring beauty and youthfulness to those around them.

In the Middle Ages, English villages had homes with maypoles to rejoice and celebrate May Day. Villagers would go into the woods to find maypoles set up from towns and cities. Because maypoles came in different sizes, villages would compete with each other to see who had the tallest one.

The Moyaone Morris Dancers, now numbering 12, will be on hand. We have invited other Morris groups from the National Capital Region to join us.

Tentative schedule for the Moyaone May Day:

At dawn	Raising of the maypole on the soccer field. Pancake breakfast at the food pavilion.
1:30 pm	Processional to the maypole, followed by dancing around the maypole, singing and Morris dancing.
2:30 on	An "improper tea" with beer from the Moyaone Brewing Collective, wood-fired pizza, and general Moyaone potluck.
4:00 pm	Moyaone Spring Games: Tug of War (adults vs. kids) Sack and Wheelbarrow Races Wellie Toss.
