- All community members who've paid their Consolidated Fees. We are a community. Our roads, our pool, our commonly-owned buildings and fields are all maintained with the funds we generate as a community. Thank you for investing in the Moyaone Reserve!

Two important notices:

- The Annual Meeting is May 3 at 3PM at the Wagner Community Center, 2311 Bryan Point Road. A special email will go out shortly with all the particulars, including agenda, December Budget Meeting minutes, proxy form, proposed slate of officers, and a special request for taking some funds from the Association's investment account.
- The Roads Committee has identified several long-standing problem spots along our roads. Repair costs are outside the scope of our regularly budgeted maintenance costs which generally include leaf blowing, grading, snow removal and other road improvement projects. How do we fund these major roads projects? The membership will be asked to vote on using money from the Association investment fund—money set aside for issues such as these—to fund these specific projects. Please read through the Roads Committee analysis of work to be done, either found elsewhere in this newsletter or in the Annual Meeting email, and be prepared to discuss at the May 3 Annual Meeting.

Finally, I'd like to urge everyone reading this article to think about how YOU can volunteer in this community. There are literally hundreds of tasks that need doing. Many require less than 4 hours to complete. Some require just a few hours each week or each month. Some require constant oversight. What are your talents? Where can you serve?

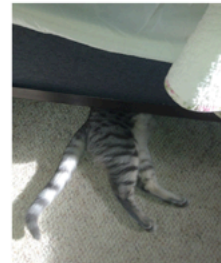


Jinny likes to be busy, and she very much wants a cat door that will allow her to go outside and play.

Washington native & veteran blues guitarist, LINWOOD LEE TAYLOR has performed & toured internationally, fronted his own band and did an around the world, two-year stint with the Joe Lewis Walker band. Linwood performed on stage with some of the biggest names in blues: Albert Collins, Lonnie Mack, and Eddie Kirkland to name just a few. His discography includes a number of his own CDs, as well as numerous cuts on various blues compilation albums. Linwood was featured on the cover of Washington Post Magazine in their story highlighting the Year of the Blues, and he was once honored in Living Blues Magazine as one of the Top 40 Under 40 blues guitarists.

Bassist STEVE WOLF has been a fixture on the Washington music scene since the late 60s. During that time he has performed throughout the United States and Europe with such D.C. area notables as Danny Gatton, Tom Principato, Phil Wiggins, The Nighthawks, Catfish Hodge, Deanna Bogart, Bob Margolin, Big Joe Maher, and a diverse group of national artists ranging from Chuck Berry, The Coasters and Bo Diddly to Doctor John, Brian Auger and Springsteen sax man Clarence Clemons. His well respected work in the blues arena has led him to back Chicago blues legends Sunnyland Slim, Pine Top Perkins, Charlie Musselwhite, Guitar Junior (Luther Johnson), and many others.

This special concert will also feature the music of MEMPHIS GOLD, who has graced the cover of numerous blues and music publications, and has shared this uniquely American art form with audiences around the world. In this time of musical fads and gimmicks, his music is real and heartfelt. Here's how the British publication "Blues & Rhythm" describes him: "Memphis Gold stands with one foot in the past and one foot in the present...[he] could be one of the youngest (and one of the last) to have picked cotton on the Dockery and Stovall plantations. Appreciative of his roots, yet too young to be completely anchored in the past, his original music moves forward with funky rhythms, odd chord changes and structures, and his own idiosyncratic view of life.

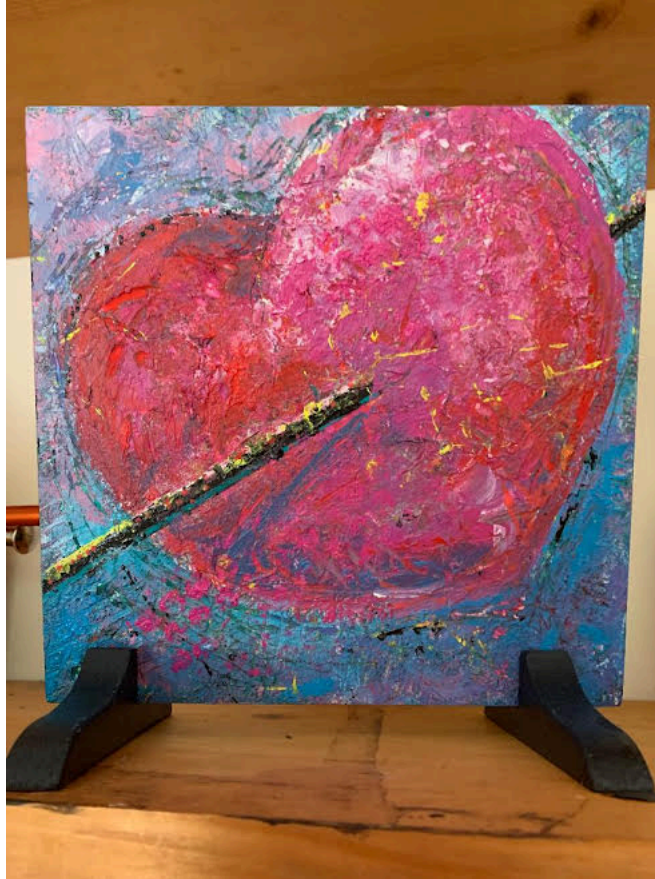

Spring into Birding: A Walk on the Boardwalk

Join us for a bird walk on the Marsh Boardwalk at Piscataway Park. This is a beautiful and easy walk on a boardwalk that traverses tidal marshland along the Potomac River. It is approximately a 1.6 mile out-and-back trail. On the walk we should see migratory birds and other avian species such as Red-headed Woodpeckers and Great Blue Herons along the marsh, gull species on the Potomac River, and field species. Bald Eagles and raptors are prevalent.

Bluebird Monitoring

We will begin bluebird monitoring again this year! This is a recurring volunteer position with a limited number of slots for volunteers. We are looking for another monthly volunteer to join our small cohort of other bluebird monitor volunteers. Monitors will assign themselves a day each week of the bluebird season to take care of our bluebird nestboxes and collect data on the bluebirds. The season typically begins in March and ends in November. Volunteer with the Park Maintenance Crew

Our Maintenance crew is looking for a couple extra sets of hands to help out around the park. We are looking for folks to volunteer at the park and offer the following skills:

- Auto mechanics (especially diesel mechanics)
- Carpentry
- Woodworking
- Fence Building
- Custodial Assistance

If you or someone you know is interested in volunteering with our Park Maintenance crew, please be sure to complete the volunteer interest form and indicate what skills you would like to offer! Volunteer schedules can be flexible.

Plant Surveying

We are kicking off this year with the intention to make this a big surveying year here at the park! We have added another opportunity for volunteers to help us out and have decided to start offering plant surveying sessions.

We are going to do our best to do as much plant surveying as we can on site, and we will need your help to make it happen! We want to know what exactly is growing, where, and in what quantities, so we can then determine what kind of care each part of the park is in need of. Collecting this data will also help us see how land changes over a long period of time. This data will help us create our burn plan for prescribed burns which we plan to start doing at the park in the coming years.

We plan to also include SAV (submerged aquatic vegetation) in this program as well. If you are interested in learning more about SAV or SAV monitoring, please click [here](#) to read more about the inspiring work the Chesapeake Bay Program is doing. We plan to offer SAV

monitoring opportunities at the park in the future. We will notify all volunteers of our upcoming plant surveying and SAV monitoring dates as soon as possible. Stay tuned! Updates from the Accokeek Stewardship Team

The Stewardship Team at Accokeek is currently comprised of seven people who play a key role in tending the land and park. You can read more about each of us here on the website. Our team is split up into smaller teams who focus on stewarding different parts of the park: the natural resource duo, our horticulturalist, our livestock assistant, and the park maintenance duo.

Potable Water Project at Piscataway Park

Good news: we are getting our water restored to all our facilities!! Bad news: we do not know when the project will be complete. While visiting, you may notice small colored flags or spray-painted marks throughout the park and farm. Construction crews will be on-site and there may be significant ground disturbances and possible interruptions to restroom facilities during the project. The Foundation is committed to maintaining as much access to park facilities as possible throughout the construction timeframe.

Upon project completion (which was expected to be in late March 2025), potable water will be restored to the visitor center and administration building, and the Visitor Center restrooms will have running water again. Unfortunately, the project will be on a pause until further notice. Thank you all for your patience.

Livestock Sales

We have heritage livestock for sale! We are shrinking our herd sizes a little bit to accommodate the workload for our staff and the health of the pastures we are working with. Currently, some of our Milking Devon cows, some Hog Island sheep rams, and Spanish goats (both bucks and a few does) are for sale.
